Pulphus v. Ayers 1st Amendment Amicus Brief

Viewpoint censorship of work properly accepted in a student art competition should not be allowed, according to an amicus brief submitted in January 2018 by VLAA and other arts service and advocacy organizations. The brief urged reversal of a ruling that permitted removal of a post-Ferguson painting by St. Louis artist David Pulphus from an exhibit at the U.S. Capitol. VLAA Volunteer Attorney Mark Sableman helped draft the brief and discussed the free speech implications of the case at a public forum hosted by VLAA in April, 2018.
